Dear Parent / Carer

Year 11 students will be sitting mock biology, chemistry and physics examinations from 3 December - 14 December. Students will sit separate examinations for biology, chemistry and physics. The results of these mock examinations will be used to assess your child's progress since their Year 10 mock examinations and make predictions about your child's final GCSE grade. The results of the mock examinations will also be used to decide which tier students will be entered for in their GCSE examinations. For students to take the higher tier paper in the summer they must achieve at least a grade 5 in these mock exams.

The following chapters of work will be tested in the mock examinations:

Biology: chapters 1-9 Chemistry: chapters 1-7 Physics: chapters 1-7

This week science teachers have spoken to all Year 11 students about how to approach their science revision. We would encourage you to look at and discuss this presentation with your child. Students should use the advice in the presentation to plan their revision from now until the start of the mock examinations.
