

'Ready to Learn' expectations

- We expect all pupils to follow our three St. Katherine's Ready to Learn expectations:
- Be responsible by arriving on time and fully equipped
- Be respectful by listening and speaking politely
- Be resilient by remaining on task and working hard



'Ready to Learn' expectations

What happens if a pupil is not 'Ready to Learn'?

For example: arriving late to the lesson or talking out of turn.

Their teacher will tell them that they have a "warning" and their name will be recorded. If a pupil has a second warning, they will be sent to the Ready to Learn room for a full day i.e. 5 periods (After phased introduction in Term 1 for Y7)

What is it?

At St Katherine's School all students and staff are provided with a Google Education account that provides access to all Google apps including Gmail, Google Drive and Classroom.

These systems are increasingly being used to share vital information with students and enhance learning opportunities.

All students have been given a username of the form <u>username@skdrive.orq</u>.



How can I help my child?

• Install the Chrome browser on your home machine.



- Set up the @skdrive.org login and save it on the Chrome browser.
- Ask your child to show you how work is set via Google Classroom.



- Set up Google Apps on other portable devices such as tablets and phones.
- Sign up for online training
