Ms Tallis	Year 11 art students	The GCSE exam project is now fully underway and Year 11 art students should now have evidence of quality observational drawing and artist research completed over the last four weeks. Students should spend at least <b>one hour a week on homework</b> on their art exam preparation. <b>All students have personal targets</b> to work towards, inside their paper folders kept in their portfolios. <b>Please ask to see these targets and discuss them with your child.</b> Your suggestions and conversations are very valuable to your child's progress. This exam project forms 40% of students' art GCSE grade. As well as working sessions every lunchtime in the Art Department, we are now offering after-school sessions on a Monday and Tuesday.
