Dear Parents/Carers

I am sure you will have been following the situation in the news and will be aware of the announcement yesterday that the government believes it may be in a position to begin the phased reopening of primary schools on 1 June, beginning with reception, Year 1 and Year 6. The government has also signalled an ambition to allow secondary school students with exams next year some time with their teachers before the summer holidays.

I want to reassure you that we have already begun to consider our approach to these changes and the steps we would need to take at St Katherine's that work for staff, parents/carers and children. We are expecting further detailed information from the government over the coming days and weeks and will communicate any significant updates in writing to our community.

I appreciate that this announcement will create a whole range of emotions - from excitement at bringing our community back together, to anxiety at the thought of returning to school after a long period away and under social distancing measures. We do not underestimate this challenge and will be taking all necessary steps to ensure our whole community remains safe at all times.

Finally, I would like to thank you all for your support during this time. I have been grateful for the team response from parents/carers, students and staff reflecting the true strength within our community. I share with you an email that was sent to staff from one of our Year 8 students on Saturday - it touched all of us.
