Mrs Crocker	All years	Mental Health and Wellbeing support during the summer holidays. There are services available to students and their families during the summer holidays. Mr Francis Black	All years	service for North Somerset young people that you can find <u>here</u> . We are acutely aware of how the pandemic has disrupted our usual reporting structures through the year and we look forward to our regular and revised reporting from the start of the next academic year. We acknowledge families value this communication to ensure their child/ren are on track and apologise for any frustration this has caused. We have been carefully considering the accuracy of assessment during the disruption to ensure any reported data is fair and valid based on the student





		experience. We would not wish to report on data which we are not confident with which might raise further concerns and levels of anxieties with students and families.
		To remedy this we scheduled Term 6 mock exams for Years 10 and 12 and standardised assessments in the core subjects for all Key Stage 3 year groups. Frustratingly, this has again been disrupted and as a result we have been unable to collect the full range of evidence for all students. We intend to address this in September and will report to families on these key progress indicators within Term 1.
		We have learnt from the unusual process of Centre Assessed Grades this year for Year 11 and Year 13, and we will be using the benefits this process has delivered in our ongoing assessment structures from September.
		Our updated curriculum guides will clearly outline the assessment that each year group can expect in each subject. The structure of our reports will also change next year as we relate student progress to both their prior performance on standardised tests and the age expected standard.
		Reflecting on this year and the feedback from families, we will be introducing a mixed model for progress evenings with some families invited for face to face meetings whilst others make use of the successful online meetings that we trialled this year. Full information will follow in September.

Miss Richards	All years	Important: Covid-19 onsite testing in September We have been informed by the Department for Education that we are expected to implement on site Covid-19 testing once again. Each student will be asked to complete two tests, 3-5 days apart upon their return. Testing will be carried out by students and supervised by a trained adult. Due to this, we will begin the year with a staggered re-opening to ensure that we can test students on their return. We will share details of the staggered start shortly.
