What are civil rights?

civil rights

- the rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality.
- You cannot be discriminated against based on your:
- Age,race,sex,sexual orientation,religion,national origin,pregnancy,familial status,disability,veteran status



In 1964 Stephenson achieved national fame when he refused to leave a pub until he was served, resulting in a trial on a charge of failing to leave a licensed premises.

Until the late 1960s, it was not illegal in Britain to discriminate against someone because of their race. The Bristol Bus Boycott was the country's first black-led campaign against racial discrimination, and it was the beginning of the struggle for racial equality in the UK.

<u>What did Dr Paul Stephenson do?</u>



Stephenson left Bristol to work in Coventry as a Senior Community Relations Officer. In 1972 he went to London to work for the Commission for Racial Equality.



Paul Stephenson was a social worker who in 1963 with the help of the West Indian Development Council led the Bristol Bus Boycott

In 1988 Stephenson received the Bristol City Council Community Award for Achievement and Services Rendered to the Black Community and the West Indian Community Publishers Award.

Why are we celebrating his birthday?

It is important to remember what Paul did for his community especially everyone in Bristol. He helped highlight the racism that black people face regularly and encourage us to stand up for what is right.

He is important to our house as he teaches us to stand up for what we believe in and not take anything for granted. Everyday we are inspired by him to be better and work to achieve the best we can.



How does Paul Stephenson's work link to our house values?
