Here are the latest school messages and updates for your information plus details of any letter sent home during the last week.



Students may borrow any media & equipment that they need to, next week, in preparation for this. Students should aim to complete a minimum of 6 hours work. This will put all GCSE art students in the best possible position to aim for the very highest final grades, on return in September. Students should also aim to finish any outstanding work for the Natural Forms Project during the summer break. These two projects make up 60% of the final art GCSE grade.
