Mrs Ivey	Year 11 and 10 combined science students	Some parents have asked how grading for combined science works. In combined science students take 6 papers (2 from each science subject). These papers are equally weighted. The score from each paper is added together to give a total score. The total score is then converted into a grade. Combined science is worth two GCSE grades, so students will get 2 grades. This <u>video</u> was produced by the government when the combined science qualification first started. The video explains how the grading system works in combined science compared to single (triple) science.
