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Meet a CST Trustee - Sir David Eastwood



From 1st January 2023 CST has a new Chair of Trustees - Sir David Eastwood. David grew up near Manchester, read modern history at Oxford, and taught at Oxford until 1995. He went on to be Vice Chancellor of the University of East Anglia, and Chief Executive for the Higher Education Funding Council. He retired after thirteen years as Vice Chancellor of the University of Birmingham in December 2021. While leading the University of Birmingham, he also chaired the Russell Group of Universities, Universitas 21, UCAS (the admissions universitv agency) and served on numerous national reviews and commissions including the Tomlinson Review of 14-19 Qualifications and the Westminster Education Commission.

Although nominally retired, David is a member of a number of boards including for the National Institute for Teaching and the Royal Northern College of Music.
