

Pupil Premium Charter

Our shared vision is to be the first choice secondary school for our families because we focus on the whole child encouraging high levels of achievement, resilient attitudes, a healthy mind, body, spirit and individual character.

Background

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is additional national funding which provides support for:

- Raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and closing the gap with their peers;
- Supporting children and young people with parents in the regular armed forces.

The Pupil Premium Grant per pupil for 2019-2020 is as follows:

- Pupils in Year Groups 7 to 11 recorded as Ever 6 Free School Meals (FSM) are allocated £935.
- Looked-after children (LAC) defined in the Children Act 1989 as one who is in the care of, or provided with accommodation by, an English local authority are allocated £2,300.
- Children who have ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order are allocated £2,300.
- Pupils in year groups reception to year 11 recorded as Ever 6 service child or in receipt of a child pension from the Ministry of Defence are allocated £300.
- Funding for most elements of Pupil Premium grant is determined on a backdated basis from the January census each year (i.e. funding follows a year behind the actual student and is allocated to support).

We will provide you with:

- A dedicated point of contact in school for you and your parents/carers
- Financial support towards the cost of equipment, curriculum trips and activities
- Financial support towards the cost of uniform
- Interventions such as mentoring, gifted & talented events and activities, motivational and careers-based opportunities such as visits to university and local colleges
- Priority placement on our prestigious FutureQuest programme
- 1:1 support or small group work for English and/or Mathematics, if this will benefit you
- Revision guides on loan from the library.
- Bespoke individual support from our Pastoral Team/ SEN Departments, if this will benefit you
- Priority access to a personal Careers Advisor for careers advice and guidance in Key Stage 4
- A Learning Support Plan to coordinate your support, if this will benefit you
- Partially or fully funded chromebook usage and Reader Pen, if you are eligible
- Free School Meals, if you are eligible.
