School	All years	 Following the 2019 Activities Week last July we sent out feedback questionnaires and, using your responses along with those of other stakeholders, we have conducted a review of the week. The feedback can be summarised as follows: Pupils enjoyed the opportunity to work with staff and peers outside of the classroom setting and this is a valuable opportunity to develop and strengthen relationships. Whilst some activities provide new experiences for pupils, others have little educational value and could easily be undertaken by most pupils without assistance from the school. With all trips taking place in one week, the cost of activities can mount up and become a barrier for many families. There is a lack of equity in the experience of pupils with some taking part in many off-site activities whilst others remain in school for most of the week. The cost to the school has been significant. As a result of this feedback, we will be making some changes to the way in which co-curricular activities will be delivered at St Katherine' Activities Week will no longer exist as a week in July. Trips that offer little in the way of new experience to pupils will be reconsidered. Trips with clear educational value will be scheduled across the year rather than within one week of the summer term.





		 Residential trips to Paris and Barcelona will take place in separate weeks, allowing us to potentially take advantage of cheaper deals and increase participation. Work experience for Year 10 will continue to run in the same week.

This facility allows you to set a balance below which Parentpay will e-mail out a reminder to top up. Please be aware that e-mail reminders are free but text messages are charged at 6p per message. Some parents have experienced their





		alerts being disabled over the summer break and they have had to go in and set them up again this term. Alerts can also be set up for new payment items. Bank Transfer Facility on Parentpay It can take up to 8 days for a bank to accept a new Parentpay mandate. Please do not make any payments using the bank transfer facility until the mandate has been authorised as this will lead to failed transactions. Dinner accounts can go overdrawn as a result of failed transactions. Payments should be made using debit/credit card as these payments are authorised before they come down to the school.
