



## Weekly Communication to Parents/Carers | Friday 2 October 2020

Dear Parents/Carers

Here are the latest school messages and updates for your information plus details of any letter sent home during the last week.

### HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

#### Dear Parents/Carers

As we complete the first five weeks there has been much to celebrate as we have returned to school. Thank you to everyone for all you are doing to keep us all safe as a community - it is the actions of each and everyone of us that will enable us to stay open for all students for as long as possible. We continue to 'Tighten Up Together' as students and staff now settle into the new rhythm of the school day.

We continue to review all our protocols and are currently reviewing our PE arrangements with a view to returning to changing rooms in a carefully managed process before the end of Term 1. Further details to follow. We still do not have any visitors to the school and thank you for booking appointments and for observing our protocols should you have to visit.

Students are reading more than ever at St Katherine's and our daily start to the day is calm and quiet with all students enjoying quality reading time. Ms Wyld, our librarian is working hard with our tutor teams to ensure each student has a book to enjoy reading. Please discuss your child's reading with them and continue to encourage them to read each day. We know reading before bedtime is a great routine to establish and a calm way to prepare for great sleep in preparation for the next day.

A great article in [The Guardian this week highlighting the impact and change, Paul Stephenson](#) created in our society. Over fifty years later after the Race Relations Act was introduced following Paul Stephenson's trial, we will be highlighting and discussing this with students next week as we begin our celebrations of Black History month with a series of events.

A reminder from last week - students are taking good ownership of their books and remembering them well on the whole. We encourage all parents/carers to take a look at the work completed for the week and ask your son/daughter to talk you through what they have done each week. This will help us all as we try and encourage each student to take responsibility for their books, learning and homework as we do our best to fill any gaps in important knowledge and skills.

I repeat some of the messages from last week below with **changes highlighted in yellow**. I recognise these messages are repetitive but the importance of us all remaining vigilant is vital to keep our full school functioning.

#### Tightening up together

- **Hands** - washing and hand sanitising our hands more often - there are multiple hand sanitising stations in each block, hand sanitisers in each classroom and new stations on entry to the school are being installed for staff and students. [New NHS Hands Face Spade video](#).

- **Face** - the incorrect wearing and safe hygienic keeping of face coverings is a concern. We have reshared this video with students this week - [https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9Tv2BVN\\_WTk](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9Tv2BVN_WTk) - and tried to help them understand the importance of wearing a face covering safely at all times
  - **Changes - from Monday**
    - **All students arriving at school wearing a face mask will be required to place their facemask in a resealable bag at the front of school.** All students wishing to wear a face covering, must use a new face covering once in school.
    - **All students are to sanitise their hands on arrival at the front of school**
    - All students travelling on coaches will be required to place their facemask in a resealable bag once they step off the coach;
- **Space** - we are asking staff and students to give each other space throughout the day, including at the start and end of the day to protect our bubble structure.

### Self isolation guidance

If you have been asked by Public Health England to self-isolate, we need to remind you that this is a legal requirement. The reason you or your children are being asked to self isolate is because we want to stop the spread of the virus. There are significant penalties for people who do not adhere to the self-isolation guideline. Self-isolation means that the person concerned cannot leave their home or garden. A self-isolating person can travel in the household car as long as they do not leave the car or come into contact with anyone from another household. They cannot visit other households or, for children, accompany parents to the shops.

Reminders from last week which are still all relevant:

- In accordance with Gov.UK [Safeworking in education, childcare and childrens' social care](#) and our risk assessment, we ask all families to observe the following: **to minimise contact with individuals who are unwell, if you are showing symptoms of coronavirus or have someone in your household who is, you should not be in a childcare setting, school or college. You should be at home, in line with the [guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection](#)**
- **Face coverings are a legal requirement when travelling on public transport for students in Year 7 and above. Students must wear face coverings on the buses as per our risk assessment and the legal requirement. No face covering will result in no travelling on the bus unless you have discussed this with school in advance due to the exceptions listed on gov.uk.** Should you need support in obtaining a face covering, please contact us immediately.
- To help us manage the collection at the end of the day, please arrive at or after the departure time where possible to ease the congestion. We appreciate families with multiple siblings will overlap. **Students must exit the site promptly and not gather at the top of school.**
- To help us manage the entrance to school in the morning and protect our bubble structure, **please do not drop your child/ren off until 8.40am.**

A reminder of some important points to share with our community.

- (1) Should we have a positive case at St Katherine's School during the school term, we will be following advice from Public Health England, as per government guidance and our risk assessment. We will write to parents/carers immediately as part of this process.
- (2) Our year group bubble structure will help us reduce any impact on the school community. Our buses form a further bubble structure and in the event of a positive case, this will be included as part of our process.
- (3) We have 'interaction tracing' in place through Classcharts and through our allocated seating on buses (which has now settled down).

- (4) We have daily routines and control processes in place within our community and cleaning both during and at the start and end of each day to keep St Katherine's a COVID 19 safe environment. However, we recognise all schools are vulnerable and we all remain vigilant.

We have raised the issue of testing with the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC). The advice we have been given is for parents to keep trying the portal, as additional slots are uploaded throughout the day. From onset of symptoms, the individual has 5 days to get tested, but it is crucial to maintain self-isolation until the test result is known. **The National Test and Trace have also asked us to support them in giving a clear message to schools and families that, unless someone has symptoms of COVID, they should not seek a test i.e. if you have been a close contact with someone who has confirmed Covid infection you need to self-isolate for 14 days and not get a test unless you develop symptoms.**

We are here to support all our young people with their learning at all times and please do not hesitate to get in touch if you need further support in any of the adjustments we are making.
