HEADTEACHER'S UPDATE

Dear Parents/Carers,

As Term 5 draws to a close, we have been saying farewell and goodbye to Year 11 and Year 13. Their recent experience has been unique and we are grateful for the way they have embraced their GCSE and A Level experience, taking advantage of what has been on offer and working hard to prepare for their final assessments. The assessments have run smoothly and we look forward to celebrating in August on the earlier dates this year - A Level Results 11 August, GCSE Results 13 August.

It has been wonderful to see the Duke of Edinburgh and sporting fixtures return to the calendar at the end of this term and we look forward to more opportunities returning in Term 6. The students are honest in sharing just how much they miss this aspect of school life and how much this benefits their personal development. We are excited about the new school year as we leave our bubbles behind.

As we prepare for the new academic year, we have been reviewing the end of Term 6 arrangements, important training and curriculum development missed due to the dominance of Centre Assessed Grades this term and teachers returning to their classrooms within our faculty structure, as opposed to year group bubbles. We have therefore decided that Monday 19 July and the half day on Tuesday 20 July will be INSET days. This means the last full day in school for students will be Friday 16 July. We will be sharing summer projects during Term 6 with students which will allow students to consolidate learning from this year and provide insight into what they have ahead in September when they progress to the next year group.

For Term 6, we have updated our <u>risk assessment</u> which is now available. The main change is with regard to face coverings. We expect staff and students to wear face coverings in corridors and communal areas, with them being optional in the classroom environment. We will be reminding students of this when we return. Whilst new strains of the virus continue to appear, we will of course continue to monitor the situation and make any adjustments in line with Department for Education guidance. With this in mind, we have been reminded to continue testing over half term as lockdown eases, to help stay ahead of the virus. Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 have no symptoms and are spreading the virus without knowing. This includes those who have had their vaccine.

Wishing you all a restful break with your family and no doubt we are all relieved to see some fine weather in the forecast.

We are here to support all our young people with their learning at all times and please do not hesitate to get in touch if you need further support in any of the adjustments we are making.
