Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility at St. Katherine's School

Everyone who is part of the St Katherine's School community has an important role to play in helping to identify welfare concerns and possible indicators of abuse or neglect at an early stage.

It is important to remember that children can be abused by other children as well as adults. Abuse can take place face to face, online, in the home and in the child's wider community.

It is vital that any concern you have for a child's welfare, however small is passed to our Designated Safeguarding Lead.

St. Katherine's School has policies and procedures in place to deal effectively with child protection and safeguarding issues together with recording and monitoring processes.

To promote a safe environment for young people at St. Katherine's School our selection and recruitment policy includes all statutory checks on staff and regular volunteers including Enhanced DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) checks.

All staff are trained to a level appropriate to their safeguarding responsibilities ranging from basic awareness for all to Level 2 for some staff. Other safeguarding training is attended by relevant staff and governors. This training is monitored and comprehensive records kept by our Human Resources Manager.

All concerns are passed through members of staff who are trained as "Designated Child Protection Officers" in school in compliance with the HM government "Working Together To Safeguard Children" guidance (July 2018) and "Keeping Children Safe In Education" (September 2018). Staff are required to report any causes of concern to the school safeguarding team using our Class Charts system.

Attendance is monitored closely and concerns are shared as appropriate with parents/carers, the Education Welfare Service, Social Care and the school Safeguarding Team. St. Katherine's School will work effectively with other agencies and parent/carers when necessary to safeguard young people.

If you have any serious concerns about your child or any other student at St. Katherine's School please do not hesitate to contact the Designated Safeguarding Lead who will be able to provide you with the best advice and help using the appropriate degree of confidentiality.
