| Mrs Slater | Years 7&8 | An exciting opportunity for young people with SEND, are vulnerable, from challenging circumstances or entitled to Free School Meals to be a part of a Creative Music Programme. This is the fifth course within the initiative and is open to young people who are new and those that have attended before. Students will create music using a range of instruments and our voices, inspired by the world around us. There will be a sharing of our work through 'show and tell' at the end of the final day for parents, carers, family and friends. Students will: Be in school years 7 to 8. No particular music skill is required (they don't need to be able to play an instrument, but it's fine if they do). Need to be self-supporting and independent young people, able to sustain involvement in a two-day creative project without additional support. Students are likely to present mild to moderate communication, interaction, sensory, cognition or learning difficulties. Available to attend all days There is no cost to participants to attend this programme; the course is fully funded by the Music Service. | Mr Court | Year 11 | As year 11 approach the end of their time at St Katherine's, I would like to share some key dates with you: |
| | | Friday 6th May - World Food Day: We will have at least 6 stalls selling snacks from all over the world for between 50p and £1. This will help us celebrate Eid and raise money for the prom. Thursday 23rd June - Final exam (Physics)*: For the vast majority of students, this will be their last compulsory day. We would ask that once students have completed their exam, they leave the site. There will be a space for students to wait if they require school transport to get home. Thursday 7th July - Leavers' day and prom: We are in the process of arranging a day to celebrate everything this cohort have achieved. This will be an opportunity to sign shirts, see friends and say goodbye to teachers. In the evening we will be hosting our Prom at Leigh Court, details of which have been communicated previously and will be on Parent Pay soon. *Some students have a Polish exam the following week and there is a contingency day in place in case of any national issues with exam completion. |
| | | As we enter the examination period, students are expected to attend school as normal. A series of booster sessions, as detailed here , are planned for students on the day of or prior to the exam. Other than these boosters, students will attend their normal lessons. If their course has finished, students will be expected to revise independently for their remaining exams whilst in their normal timetabled lessons. They should therefore attend school with the resources that they require but staff will be available to provide resources such as past papers on request. |
| | | The full timetable including all lessons and exams can be seen here . You will note from the timetable that any two exams within the same subject are separated by a minimum period of 10 days. This is to allow for any absence due to COVID related illness. Should a student test positive for COVID and |



| | | therefore miss an exam they would require confirmation of a doctor's note. Following the minimum period of absence they will then be able to return to any remaining exams and provided that at least one third of the scheduled examinations have sat a grade will be awarded on the basis of completed papers only. |
