MESSAGES		
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Mr Francis Black	All Years	We are now beginning the process of planning school transport for 2022/23. We continue to work closely with Turners who are facing increased costs and competition with wage and fuel cost inflation. We have worked hard together to minimise any increased costs and an additional £5 per month is necessary to keep the service running smoothly. The cost for the full year in 2022/23 will be £900 payable in ten monthly instalments of £90 from September to June. We are able to offer discounts for pupils in receipt of free school meals or pupil premium funding so please contact bonoraf@skdrive.org if you would like to discuss your personal circumstances. All current bus users should have received a personal email asking you to confirm your requirements for next year via an online form. Please complete this even if you do not require a place for next year. If you are on the waiting list for a bus place or would like to be added to the list for next year then please complete this form for new users. We will then include this in our planning in the hope of accommodating all who require
		transport.
Mr Court	Year 11	As year 11 approach the end of their time at St Katherine's, I would like to share some key dates with you: Friday 6th May - World Food Day: We will have at least 6 stalls selling snacks from all over the world for between 50p and £1. This will help us to celebrate Eid and raise money for the prom. Thursday 23rd June - Final exam (Physics)*: For the vast majority of students, this will be their last compulsory day. We would ask that once students have completed their exam, they leave the site. There will be a space for students to wait if they require school transport to get home. Thursday 7th July - Leavers' day and prom: We are in the process of arranging a leavers' day to celebrate everything this cohort have achieved. This will be an opportunity to wear fancy dress, sign shirts, see friends and say goodbye to teachers, tutors and staff. It is likely to take place 09:00-12:00. In the evening we will be hosting our Prom at Leigh Court, details of which have been communicated previously and will be on Parent Pay soon. *Some students have a Polish exam the following week and there is a contingency day in place in case of any national issues with exam completion. As we enter the examination period, students are expected to attend school as normal. A series of booster sessions, as detailed here, are planned for students on the day of or prior to the exam. Other than these boosters, students will attend their normal lessons. If their course has finished, students will be expected to revise independently for their remaining exams whilst in their normal timetabled lessons. They should therefore attend school with the resources that they require but staff will be available to provide resources such as past papers on request. The full timetable including all lessons and exams can be seen here. You will note from the timetable that any two exams within the same subject are



		separated by a minimum period of 10 days. This is to allow for any absence due to COVID related illness. Should a student test positive for COVID and therefore miss an exam they would require confirmation of a doctor's note. Following the minimum period of absence they will then be able to return to any remaining exams and provided that at least one third of the scheduled examinations have sat a grade will be awarded on the basis of completed papers only.
