St Katherine's School: Provider Access Policy

1. Introduction

- Providing high-quality careers education and guidance in schools and colleges is
 essential for shaping young people's futures. It equips them with a solid understanding
 of the world of work, including the various pathways to jobs and careers they may find
 fulfilling and rewarding. This guidance also helps them develop crucial self-awareness
 and career management skills, enabling them to make informed decisions and pursue
 positive employment outcomes. Ultimately, it empowers students to take control of their
 futures, enhances their life prospects, and supports a thriving, productive economy.
- With the number of apprenticeships growing each year, it is more important than ever that all young people are fully informed about the full range of post-16 and post-18 options available to them — including broader technical education pathways such as T Levels and Higher Technical Qualifications.
- St Katherine's School is dedicated to providing students with access to a wide range of education and training providers, ensuring they are well-informed about approved technical qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities. The school recognises its responsibility to guide students toward pathways that lead to successful outcomes in both education and employment, helping to develop the skilled workforce that employers need. In fulfilling this duty, St Katherine's remains impartial, upholding its statutory responsibility to present all post-16 and post-18 routes academic and technical without bias.
- St Katherine's is committed to ensuring that all students are informed about the full range of pathways to higher-level skills, including access to up-to-date information on technical education and apprenticeships. This commitment aligns with the Department for Education's guidance (July 2021) under the "Baker Clause" — supporting students to understand all available education and training options — as well as the updated Provider Access Legislation (January 2023).

2. Aims

The St Katherine's policy for access to other education and training providers is guided by the following aims:

- To broaden students' knowledge and awareness of the full range of career pathways available to them, including technical qualifications and apprenticeships.
- To enable young people to explore education and training opportunities beyond school, supporting them in making well-informed decisions about their future.

3. Pupil Entitlement

• St Katherine's fully supports the statutory requirement for students to have direct access to a range of providers offering further education, technical training, and apprenticeships. The school is committed to meeting the legal duty to provide a minimum of six meaningful encounters with approved providers of technical education and apprenticeship opportunities. These encounters will take place through activities such as assemblies during National Apprenticeship Week and National Careers Week, as well as through provider participation in careers events hosted by the school or across the Trust.

Development

• This policy has been developed and is reviewed annually by the Careers Leader and Line Manager (Sara Gardiner and Alan Francis-Black), in line with current best practice guidelines issued by the Department for Education.

Links with other policies

 It is supported by, and aligned with, key school policies, including those relating to Careers, Child Protection, Equality and Diversity, and Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

Students are entitled

- To learn about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities as part of a comprehensive careers programme, which outlines the full range of education and training options available at each key transition point.
- To hear from a variety of local providers about the opportunities they offer including technical education and apprenticeships through events such as assemblies, group discussions, taster sessions, and options evenings.
- To understand how to research, prepare for, and apply to the full range of academic and technical courses.
