

Welcome back to Term 1

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of a new school year – though I'm not sure where all this rain has suddenly come from! Despite the soggy start, there's a real buzz around school and a sense of excitement for the year ahead.

In our first school assembly, we celebrated the fantastic successes of our A Level and GCSE students this summer and reflected on the *ingredients of success*: excellent attendance, consistent homework, reading for at least 20 minutes every day, being ready to learn in every lesson, setting ambitious goals, and building strong habits and routines. We also spoke about the importance of resilience – one of our school's core values. Sometimes success requires us to hear feedback we may not like (what we call "tough love"), bounce back from disappointments, lean on each other for support, and keep moving forward.

I challenged all our students to identify their 1% change this year – a small but powerful improvement in their daily habits that, over time, will make a huge difference. As James Clear reminds us in Atomic Habits, those small gains add up to extraordinary results. Our next step as a school community is to explore how we can make these new habits stick!

It was brilliant to see all year groups back together last Friday, and Year 7s in particular have settled in very well this week. All lessons feel purposeful, and it's lovely to see new students navigating their way confidently around school, arriving well-prepared, and taking real pride in their books and equipment. Bookwork and pride has been a focus in House assemblies this week led by Mr Ovink.


